OUR MISSION

To enable all young people, *especially those who need us most*, to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible citizens.

If there was good news in 2021, it was childcare emerging towards the top of most lists and considered essential. This was no surprise to us. Hearing leaders mention it locally and across the country as a priority was the pleasant surprise.

For over 75 years we know we've been considered essential by kids and families. Our activities fit many circumstances and fill gaps in the lives of youth. This happens every day throughout the year. Our doors stay open.

As we learned last year, emergencies create situations that need to be addressed. Who would have predicted virtual school, masks, social distancing, and limited activities for kids?

In response, we pivoted quickly when asked to keep our doors open. Initially for first responders and those providing healthcare and later to parents that could not work virtually. This meant longer hours of operation and tackling hybrid school schedules. Our youth development professional staff took this on with few complaints knowing it was the right thing to do for their kids and families.

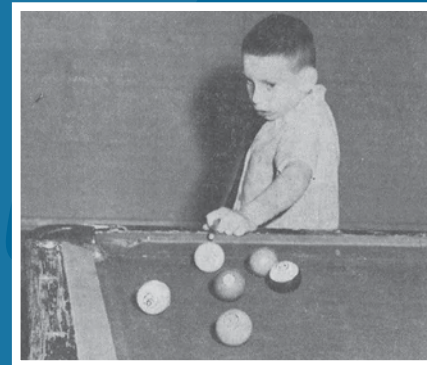

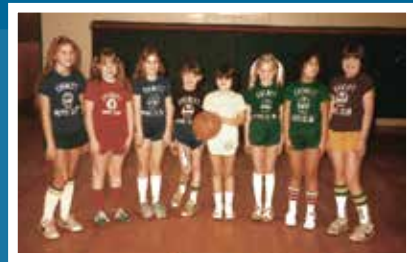

MORE THAN JUST SNOHOMISH COUNTY

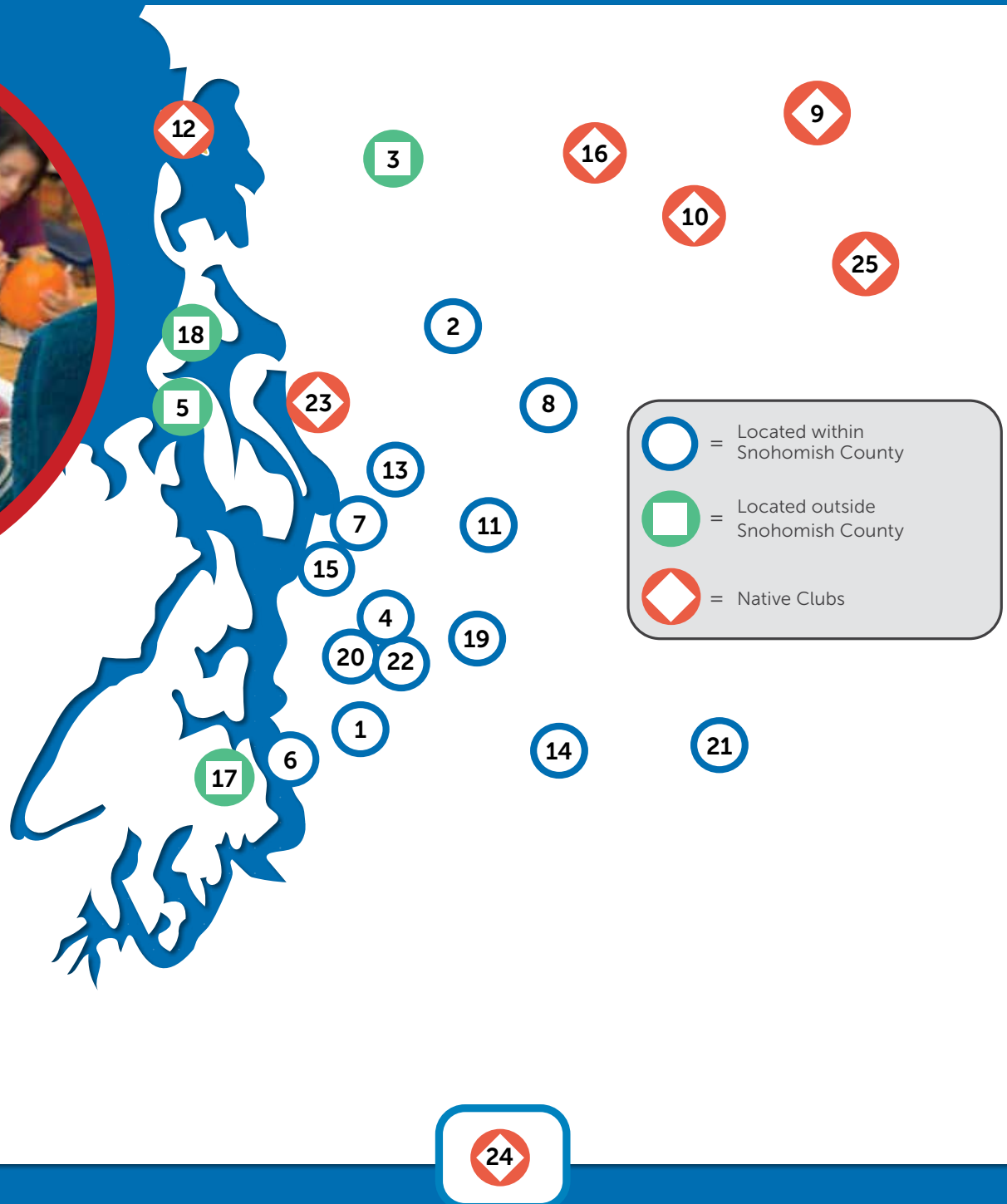

NATIVE CLUBS

Since 1997, we have expanded our partnership with 5 Native American tribes across Washington and Oregon to include a total of 7 Clubs on Native lands.





1973

Our first annual auction was on September 22, 1973 to raise funds for Everett, Mukilteo and Edmonds Clubs. It was a night of dining, dancing and bidding held at the Everett Holiday Inn. By 1974 we chartered a new Club in Arlington. The Arlington Club started out in a rented church and then moved to a store front downtown.

VIRTUAL LEARNING LABS

Academic success has always been one of our top priorities. After the successful shift to virtual learning in 2020, teen rooms, art rooms, gyms and computer labs were temporarily transformed into Zoom classrooms where kids had the space to meet with teachers. 2021 marked the welcome return to in-person schooling and the re-start of our traditional before and after school educational programming.

1984

In 1982 Boys Clubs of Snohomish County officially changed its name to Boys & Girls Clubs of Snohomish County to encompass the girls who had been attending the Club for years. It would be another 8 years before Boys Clubs of America changed their name to include girls. Tony Agtarap from our Edmonds Club became our first National Youth of the Year in 1984. Tony and peers from around the country went to Washington D.C. and met President Ronald Reagan.

The 1990's was a time of growth and expansion for BGCSC. Sultan (1990), Alderwood (1991), Tulalip (1997), and Granite Falls (1998) were all established expanding our reach into Snohomish County. Tulalip Club was the first Club established on Native land in Washington and was the 6th in the country. New Club buildings were built for Arlington (1992) and Monroe (1997). The Everett Club saw renovations in 1997 and Gaffney Field was built in 1998. In 1998 we had our second National Youth of the Year, Liberty Franklin, from our Everett Club.







SAFETY & SECURITY

In 2020 we saw the resiliency of our staff and youth as schools changed to virtual learning and our clubs expanded their hours to accommodate full-day care.

2021 brought the welcomed return to in-person schooling. Following Health District protocol, BGCSC responded with the careful return to team sports and traditional before and after school enrichment programming.

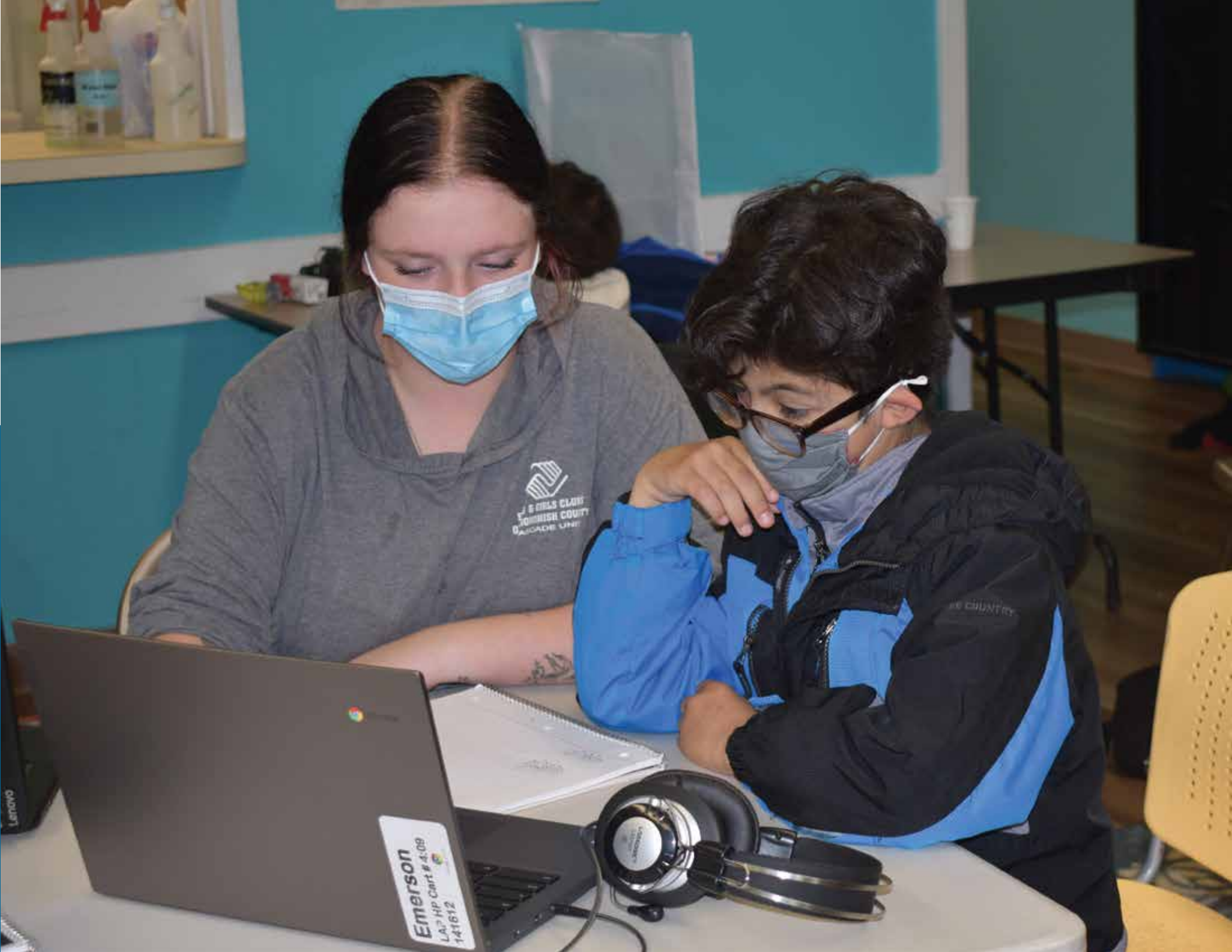
2000

In 2000 the S. Everett/Mukilteo Club opened, followed by the Snohomish Club in 2003, Lake Stevens and Cascade in 2004, and Marysville in 2009. The multipurpose field at Arlington was renamed the Cal Kinney Field to honor Cal's work in the community to build the Club in 1992. In 2005 a gym was added to the Lake Stevens Club.



COVID Changes

As things rapidly changed so did the protocols at the Clubs to keep staff and youth safe and healthy. Health screenings, mandatory mask wearing inside and outside for all, and keeping socially distant became the daily norm. Due to transportation restrictions we have been fortunate to partner with an increased number of school districts to ensure students got to school. Club staff and coaches received trainings on COVID protocols, cleaning and PPE requirements.





MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT STAFF

In collaboration with Snohomish County and Providence Hospital Foundation, we were able to hire Behavioral Health Coordinators to support both Club members and staff with SEL programming and trauma-informed practices.

2007

With growth comes loss. In 2007 we closed our Granite Falls Club after losing our lease. But the Club reopened in 2013, and has continued to grow ever since. On Christmas Eve 2010, the Sultan Club burned down. The Club kept operating in a shared space at the Volunteers of American Sky Valley Family and Community Resource Center until an all-new Club opened in 2015.

NATIVE CLUBS

Since 1997 Boys & Girls Clubs of Snohomish County has been partnering with Native American tribes to establish Clubs on tribal land. Tulalip Boys & Girls Club was the first tribal club in Washington and the 6th in the United States. Over the last 24 years we have added Clubs at Wellpinit, Lummi, Warm Springs and three Clubs on the Colville Reservation. Our 7 Clubs help to make up the 226 Native American Boys & Girls Clubs.

Thank you to Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, Lummi Nation, Spokane Tribe of Indians, The Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation and The Tulalip Tribes for your support and funding for our Native Clubs.

The Oak Harbor Club joined the BGCSC family in 2011 and the Warm Springs Club joined in 2014. The Warm Springs Club is located on the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs reservation. Construction at Tulalip in 2012 created three new program spaces; a music room with recording studio, an all-purpose program room and undersea exploration center. Our InspireHer program was launched in 2014 to help mentor and provide specific workshops for girls. Thanks to our friends at the Cal Ripken Sr. Foundation and Everett Community College, Gaffney Field was upgraded to artificial turf in 2014.

IMAGINE THE IMPACT

TODAY

Since 2015 we have established six Clubs outside of Snohomish County including five on tribal land. Brewster opened in 2015, followed by Inchelium (2015), Wellpinit (2016), Lummi (2017), Nespelem (2017), and Keller (2019). Through partnerships with The Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation, Spokane Tribe of Indians, and Lummi Nation, we have been able to serve the needs of more Native youth.

Buildings continued to be built and expanded to allow for more youth to attend and use our Clubs. Sultan Club added a new gym in 2017. In 2019 the new Mukilteo Club opened, as well as the new Tulalip Teen Multimedia Center. The Oak Harbor Club started 2021 with opening their newly renovated building.

Oak Harbor Club

Throughout 2020 work was being completed on the newly renovated building for the new Oak Harbor Club. For 17 years, the Oak Harbor Boys & Girls Club occupied the Roller Barn. The new Club building gives more program space and a dedicated room for our Teens. The large multi-purpose room and STEAM room are used daily for virtual learning.



Granite Falls Gym

Throughout much of 2021 and the beginning of 2022, construction took place on the new gym for our Granite Falls Club. The 9,300 square foot gymnasium has six adjustable-height backboards, bleachers and a state-of-the-art electronic scoreboard. The gym will provide countless hours of sports and fitness programming. We are excited to have the new gym and look forward to the next basketball and volleyball seasons.

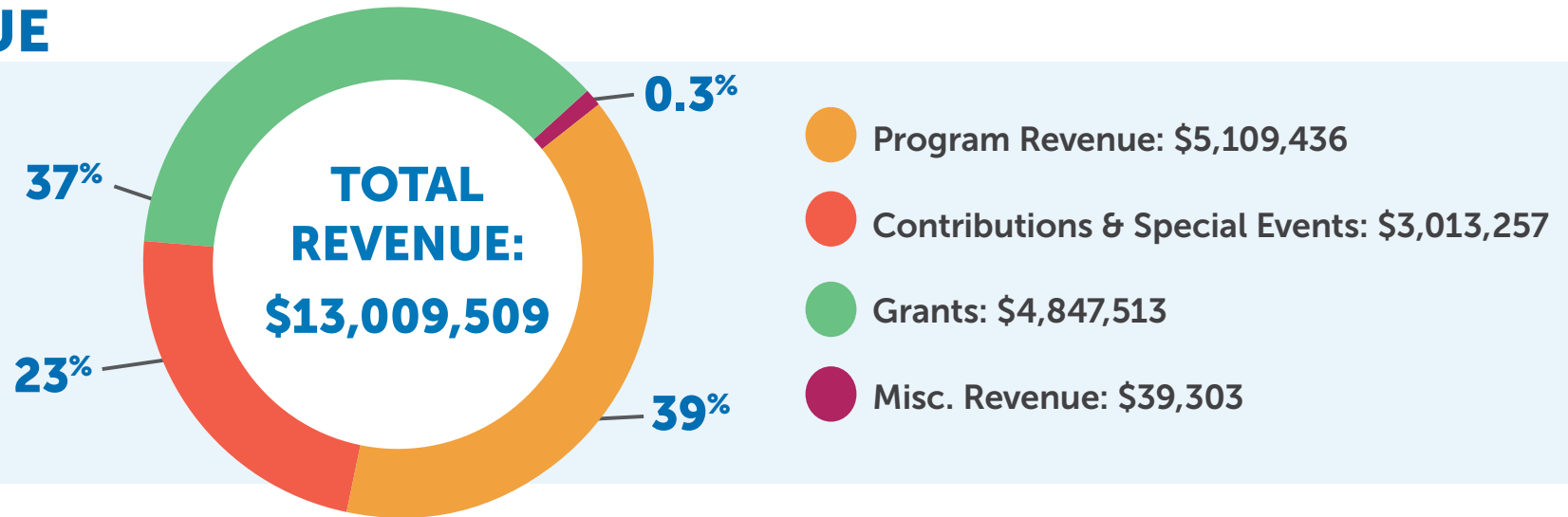

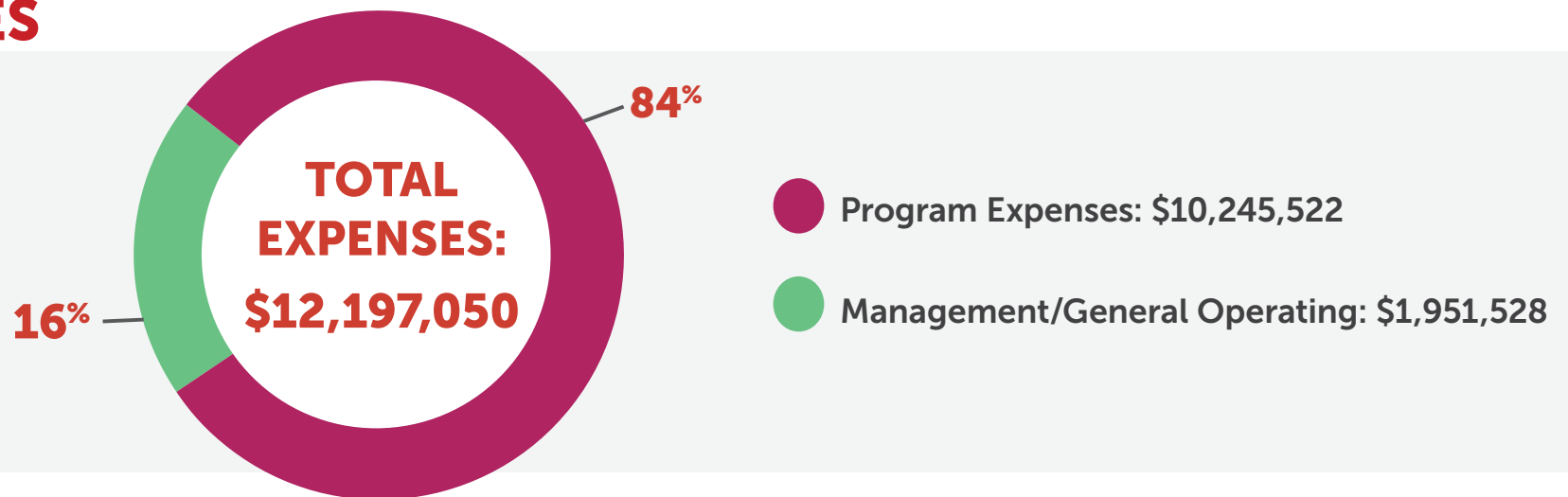
