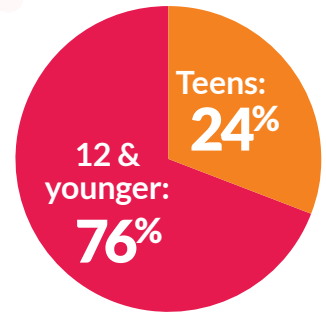
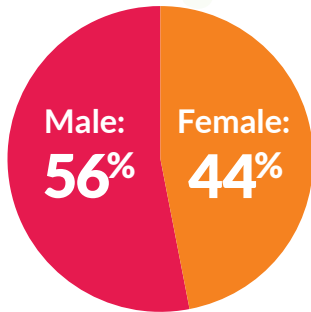

MORE THAN JUST SNOHOMISH COUNTY

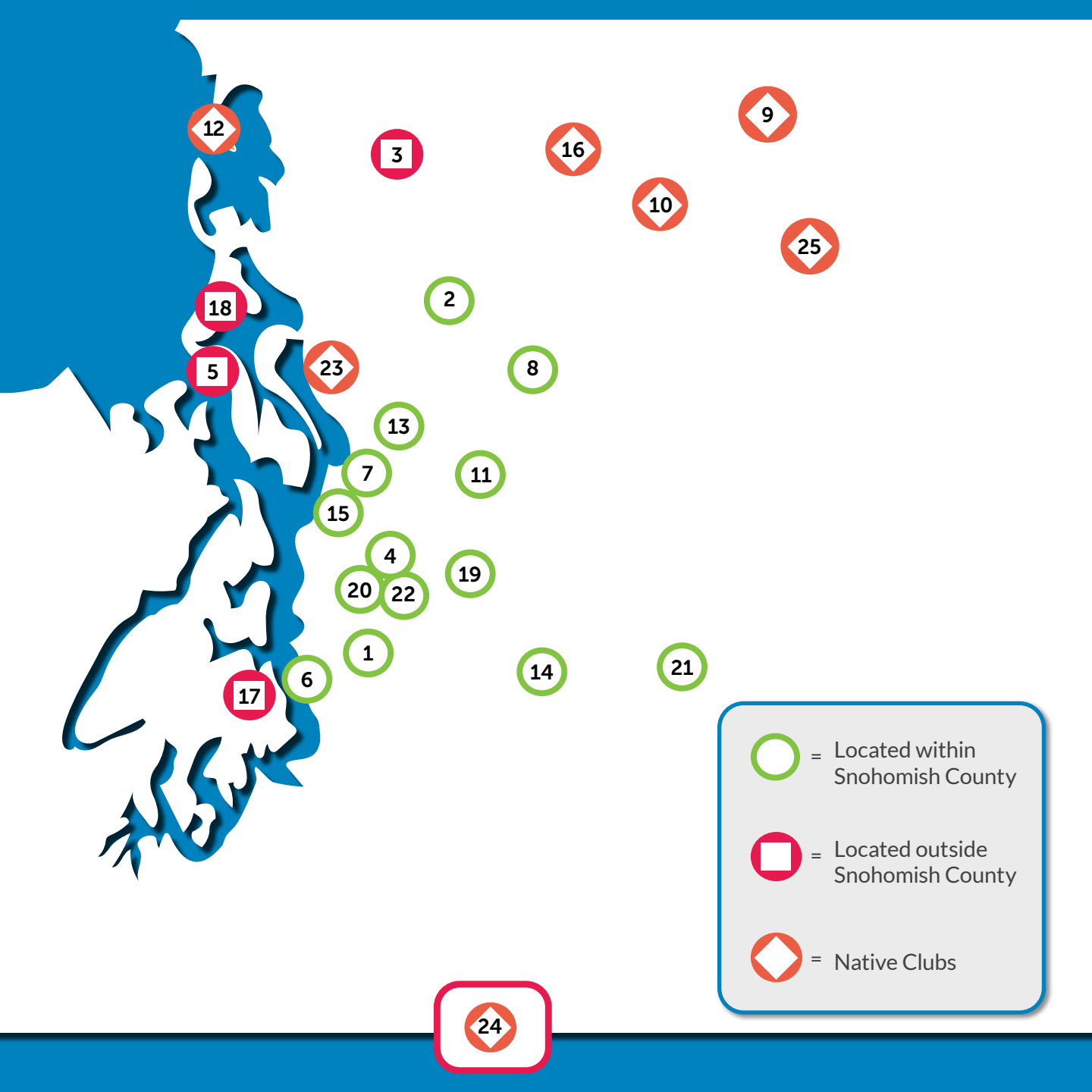

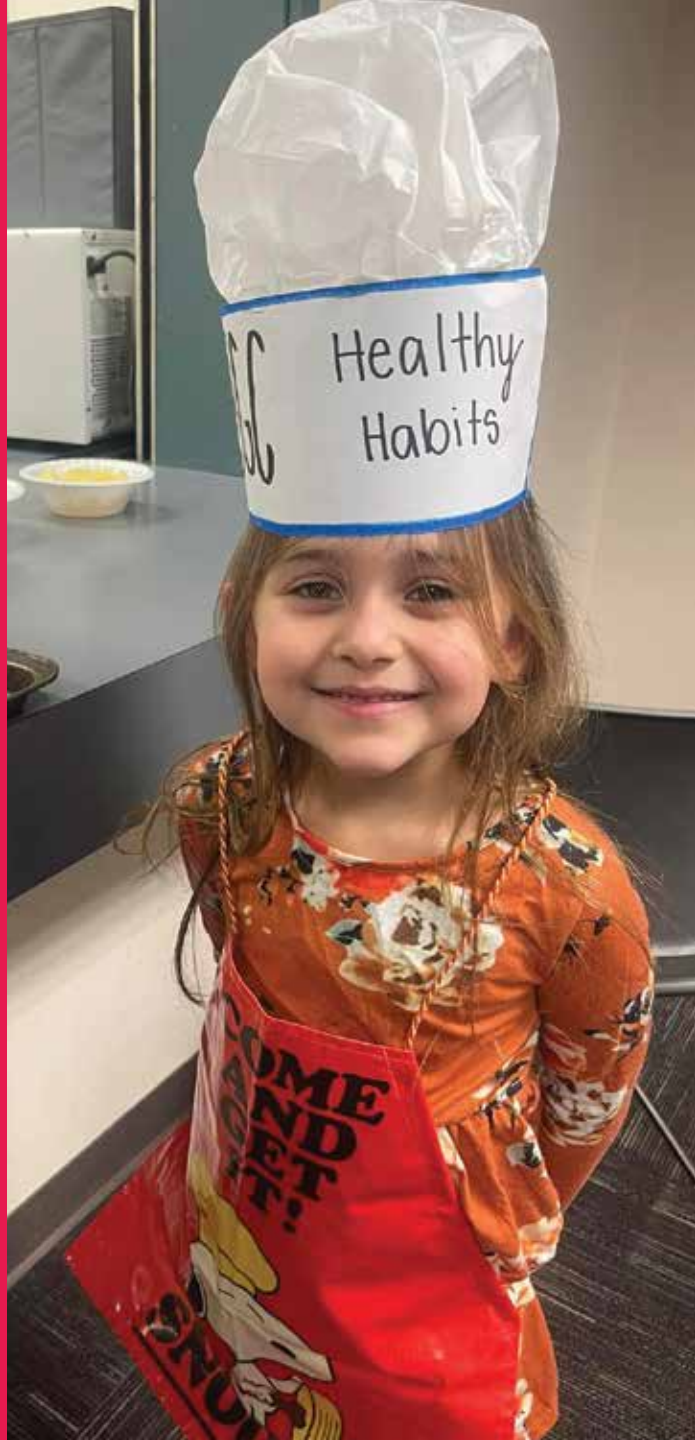
Smart Moves

We aim to inspire young people to make a difference in their communities, promote positive self-image, develop strong character, teach effective conflict resolution strategies, and empower youth to respect different cultures.

What is Youth of the Year?

Youth of the Year is the premier youth recognition program in the Boys & Girls Club world. One teen representative from each Club participates in the annual process which includes essay writing, obtaining letters of recommendation, and public speaking. Each youth is interviewed by a panel of judges and delivers their 3-minute speech focused on their club experience, obstacles they have overcome, and their plans for the future. Each of our 14 applicants received a scholarship and one youth was selected to represent the Boys & Girls Clubs of Snohomish County at the state level in March.

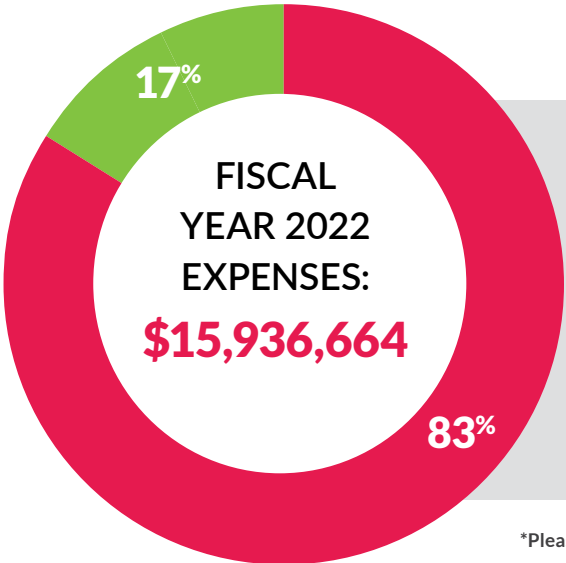
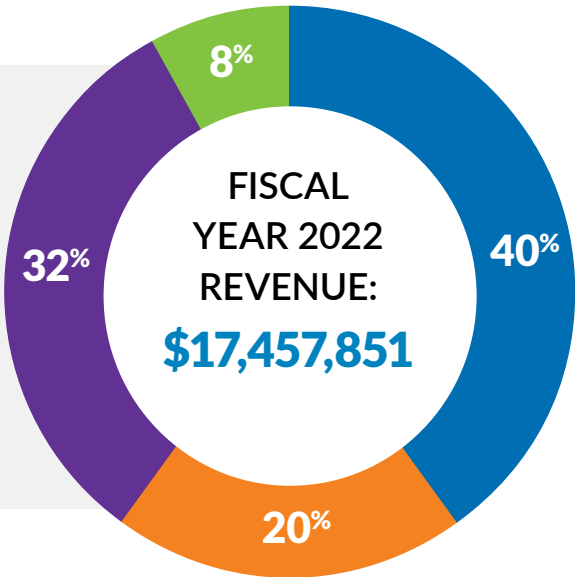

Roxi has served on the committee to select the Snohomish County Boys & Girls Club Youth of the Year for many years, in addition to funding the Bert Cronin Award and Scholarship for the winner.

Bert and Roxi's children contribute in their own way. Joe, the eldest son, has been on the BGCSC Board of Directors for the past six years. John was instrumental in the renovation of the North Everett Club and Kelli is responsible for the distribution of funds for the Youth of the Year program through the Cronin Endowment.
