Dear Friends,

As we think about all that The Boys & Girls Clubs of Snohomish County has achieved in the past year, we have a great deal to celebrate. In 2023, we saw more kids coming to our Clubs, more often. Over 23,000 youth benefited from Club programs, with over 4,000 children walking through our doors each day. Celebrating this growth is important, but as our enrollment increases, we face the challenge of meeting the expanded and diverse needs from our members.

Each of our clubs is uniquely qualified to serve their community and meet the growing needs of their youth. Our Trailside Club serves youth from the Trailside Village, a subsidized housing project. Our South Everett/ Mukilteo Club provides a safe-haven for children who face the high crime and gang activity along Casino Road. Our Brewster Club supports an underserved, migrant community. These youth face extreme food insecurity and rely on our Clubs for basic needs. Thanks to our committed donors, Clubs are able to keep a pantry stocked with healthy food, and a closet with new clothing for youth and their families.

Clubs in Lake Stevens and Alderwood have different needs, seeing an unprecedented rise in youth that want to participate in sports, resulting in the need for scholarships and gym space. The Lake Stevens Club alone had over 800 youth participate in basketball during the 2023 season and we ran the largest NFL youth flag football program in the nation. An investment in our clubs is an investment in the future of our youth and community.

We continued improving our Clubs through capital investments, while opening our 26th Club (and 8th Tribal site) with the Swinomish Indian Tribal Community.

Each of our Clubs boasts staff and volunteers committed to do “Whatever it takes” to enrich the lives of youth. We want to give thanks to our dedicated staff, board of directors, volunteers, donors and community partners for supporting our mission to serve more youth.

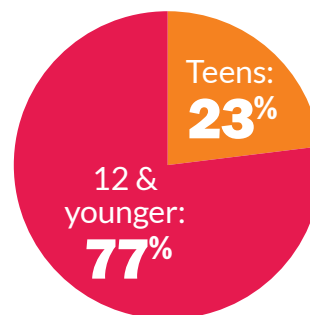
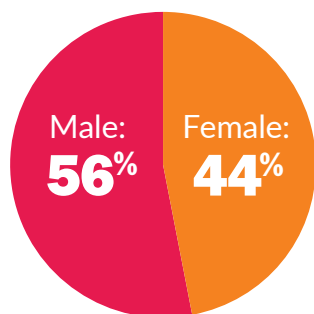

THE BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS TEAM

The statement “It takes a village” rings true within The Boys & Girls Clubs of Snohomish County organization. Living out the mission of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Snohomish County is dependent on the team made up of staff and volunteers who welcome youth to our clubs every day. Our youth development professionals practice servant leadership, providing a safe space for the 23,152 kids they inspire each day. The truth is, these staff members cannot do it alone—they are supported each day by our administrative staff and volunteers—parents, grandparents, community leaders and supporting businesses.

Many of our staff members were club kids, who grew up going to our clubs each day. They are paying it forward by living out our mission of providing our club kids an opportunity to grow and reach their full potential as productive, caring and responsible citizens.

Boys & Girls Clubs volunteers support the staff and youth of our clubs. These volunteers fulfill a variety of roles—coaching sports, tutoring youth, serving healthy meals and snacks, procuring items for our annual gala, serving on the board, judging the Youth of the Year celebration, and so much more.

PRIORITY OUTCOMES



Out-of-school time

Club youth are the leaders, innovators, and problem-solvers of tomorrow, developing skills to be agents of change in their communities.

Clubs across the country provide over 4 million young people with a safe place, caring adult mentors, friendship, and high-impact development programs during critical non-school hours. *Club members in 8th, 10th and 12th grades volunteer at significantly higher rates than their peers nationally.*



Safer childhoods

Every young person has the right to a safe, positive environment to learn and grow.

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Snohomish County are committed to supporting the youth in our communities, and Clubs ensure the safety of all its members, especially when they are not in school. *90% of Club members say they could go to staff for help in a crisis.*



Health & wellness

Every young person should be equipped to make healthy decisions, resulting in greater social, emotional, and physical well-being.

Our programs help youth engage in positive behaviors that support their well-being. Club members learn how to manage stress, work as a team, and stay active and healthy. *Club teens are less likely to use drugs or alcohol, and are more likely to engage in regular physical activity than their peers nationally.*



Education & leadership

When young people perform well academically, they graduate on time, are motivated to learn, and have a plan to succeed in today's workforce.

Clubs equip youth with the skills they need to succeed in the workforce, and creates access to partnerships to gain real-life experience and explore their career options. *Among 12-17 year-olds living in low-income households, Club members report higher grades than youth nationally.*



Diversity, equity & inclusion

The core beliefs of the Boys & Girls Clubs fuel our commitment to providing safe, inclusive and positive environments for all.

Clubs champion opportunities for the unique challenges and circumstances in communities, while respecting and celebrating their strengths and cultures. *83% of Club members believe they can make a difference in their community.*

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Our educational programs encourage learning engagement at a young age, complement regular school-day activities, enhance academic performance, and keep members on track to graduate. Clubs run summer reading programs in partnership with Sno-Isle Libraries and other local libraries.


YOUTH OF THE YEAR

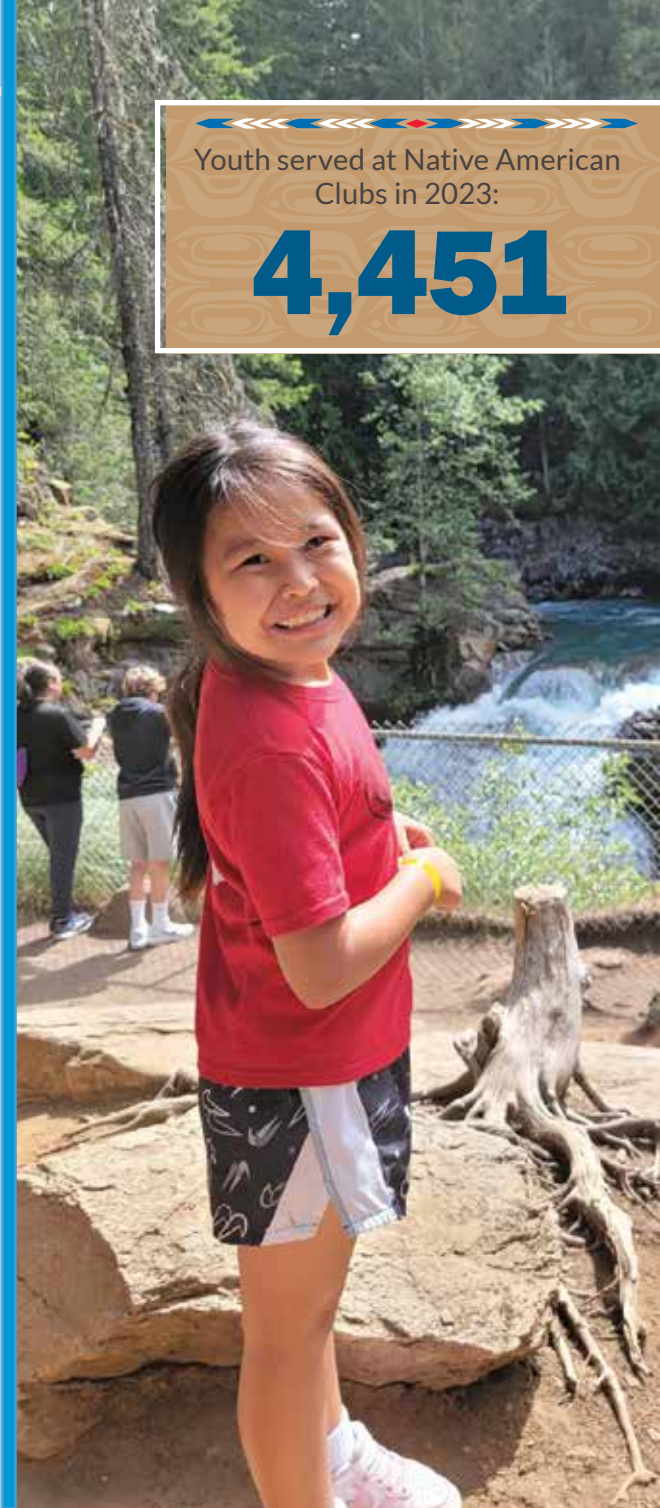
MORE THAN JUST SNOHOMISH COUNTY
