A Message from the Director

Dear friends,

Since 1992, I have had the privilege of leading The Boys & Girls Club of Snohomish County. As I reflect on the past 33 years, I am incredibly proud of the growth we have achieved to do whatever it took, to provide safe and fun places for kids.

In 1992, Snohomish County was experiencing a wave of population growth, and I saw an opportunity for our organization to expand and serve more youth. I just needed our board of directors, partners, and donors to believe in the vision. They did—and as a result, we grew from a few to 27 clubs, impacting more kids each day.

Over the years, our reach has extended beyond Snohomish County, responding to significant needs where we had the support and opportunity to make a difference. Our mission calls us to serve those who need us most, and when our tribal partners expressed a need for youth services, we answered. I am especially proud that our partnerships with local tribes have led to the establishment of eight clubs on Native lands—collaborations built on mutual trust and shared commitment, benefiting both our organizations and the communities we serve.

As I share my final community report on the eve of my retirement, I want to express my deepest gratitude to those who have helped turn this vision into reality. Thank you to our dedicated staff of over 400 youth development professionals, our 2,000+ volunteers, and our invaluable community partners, board members, and donors. Because of you, The Boys & Girls Clubs of Snohomish County have touched the lives of more than 26,000 youth in 2024.

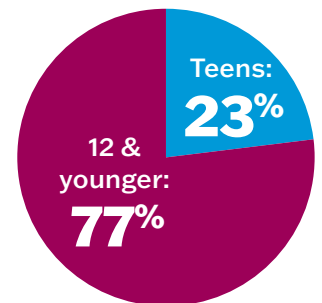
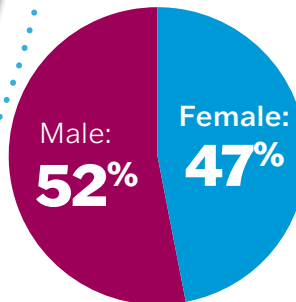

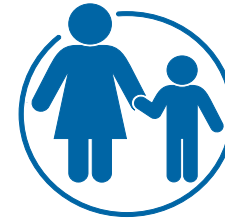
A Place to Learn & Grow

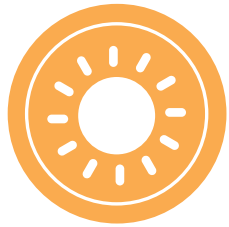

Torch Clubs are chartered small-group leadership and service clubs for boys and girls ages 10-13. Torch Club members learn to elect officers and work together to implement activities in four areas: service to Club and community, education, health and fitness and social recreation.

What is Youth of the Year?

Youth of the Year is the Boys & Girls Clubs' premier youth recognition program. One teen from each Club participates in the annual process, which involves essay writing and public speaking. They are interviewed by a panel of judges and deliver their speech focused on their Club experience and their plans for the future. Each applicant receives a scholarship and one youth is selected to represent the Boys & Girls Clubs of Snohomish County at the state level.

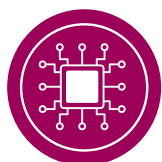

DIY STEM is a hands-on, activity-based STEM curriculum which connects youth aged 9 to 12 to science themes they encounter regularly. Through collaborative and open-ended activities, students learn principles of science, engineering, technology, and math. Each team explores a scientific phenomenon as they develop their own experiments and take on different roles within the team, creating a dynamic, unique learning experience for each member.

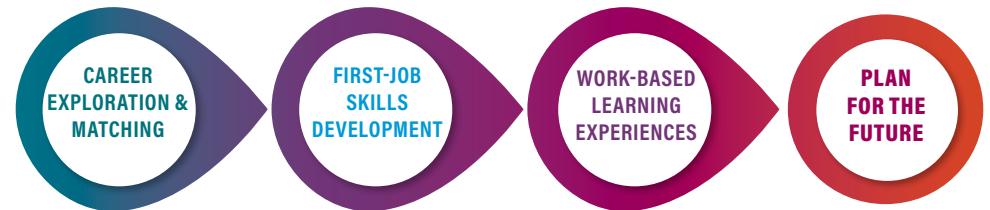

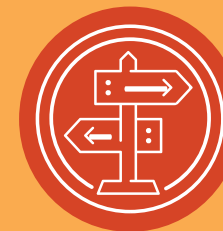

ESports

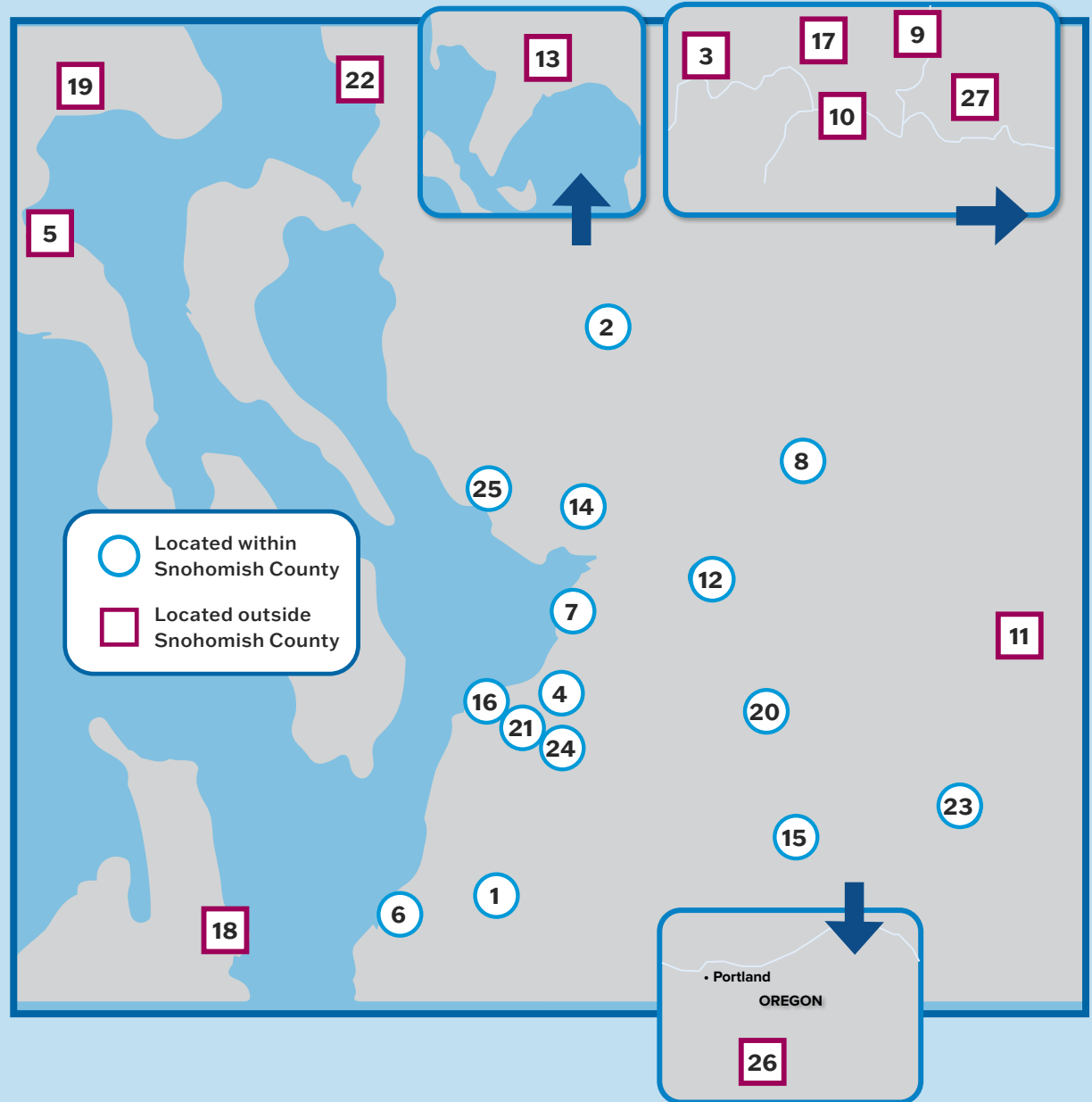

Through federal response funding distributed by Snohomish County, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Snohomish County were able to offer childcare subsidies during the height of the pandemic. With over \$2 million in county funding, we supported 1,900 families.

The County's commitment extended beyond childcare. Understanding the toll of the pandemic on youth mental health, they invested over \$500,000 to fund behavioral health support in our clubs. This initiative trained our staff to provide vital social and emotional support—an investment that will benefit young people for years to come.

For their unwavering support of families and youth, we proudly recognize Snohomish County, the County Executive, the County Council, and county staff. Their dedication continues to make a lasting difference in our community.
